Our Creative Arts team is always working on interesting projects and events that communicate and bring worship to our great God, and this year was no different!

GENERATION MINISTRY

Over the 23-24 financial year our Generation Team has expanded to become a broader Multiplying Disciple Making Ministry Team!
Our monthly ministry meeting time has moved beyond Generation into the wider Door of Hope ministry team, continuing the work of discipling people who then go and make new disciples, fulfilling the work Jesus sent us to do.

It has been a highlight to see growth in the desire of our Youth to reach their high school friends with the good news.

Oliver Mensah accompanied two of our high school students to an Alpha training event in Queensland. Wini Heron welcomed Heather Pannowitz as a key volunteer to facilitate a team of Young Adults who lead the All In monthly gatherings with a focus on Knowing People and Embracing Authenticity. This has resulted in 5 Young Adults sharing their personal testimonies.

Opening the new entrance for the Hope Discovery Family Centre and the working bees to refresh the newly named Kids' Space were highlights for the year. The impact of moving our entry was evident in the increased number of families attending Playgroup and new engagements on Sundays with our Hope Discovery Kids program.

Funding to support the ongoing development of the Centre have come from the Australian Conference on Neurodevelopmental Disorders that our ministry hosts biennially. The 2023 conference drew 400 delegates from around the state and across the nation and has been called a landmark event in Australia for the professional development calendar by a lead academic.

GENERATION VOLUNTEERS



Parenting For Faith courses provided 69 participants (parents, grandparents, ministry leaders in other churches, and Hope Discovery Kids' team) with new skills to share faith with our children. The Babies and Toddlers version of the course successfully ran as part of Playgroup, enabling parents who don't attend church to hear about God's love for them and their children.

Door Of Hope in partnership with Power To Change, held the second, Multiply Conference, involving 20 Door Of Hope ministry staff participating with church leaders from around Australia, sharing disciple making frameworks and strategies.

The Multiply Conference has now been established as an annual disciple making event for church leaders and will be held at New Peninsula, Victoria in June, 2025.

In recognition of her work in championing Parenting For Faith, Melissa Richards' has been included as the Australian Ambassador in the United Kingdom Leadership team. Caroline Crawford has expanded her Playgroup Team with two new volunteers as a direct outcome of her time at the Multiply Conference.



PASTORAL CARE

Loving and caring for one another and the community in which we live is a central tenet of the gospel. At DOHCC we seek to live out that tenet in a variety of ways. Within church when an extra level of support might be required our Pastoral Care team of staff and volunteers can provide assistance including spiritual support, meals and practical assistance when ill or through pregnancy or in a crisis, home or hospital visitation and a team leading Senior's gatherings.

It is also our privilege to be able to provide support within the community. With the cost of living pressures there is an increasing demand for food and practical help from the wider community. Our Christmas Hamper ministry has assisted many individuals and families and developed relationships with a broad range of community organisations such as Community Corrections, schools and domestic violence shelters. We have a team who reach out to residents of Levi House with cooking and craft activities and we have a team who support individuals in Risdon Prison and their families.

For assistance dealing with significant life issues we have a professional and confidential counselling service that operates on a Monday.

MADWHEELS

MadWheels (Making A Difference Wheels) started in 2004 with a \$100 note and a vision to help the community. It has now grown into a fully equipped automotive workshop within the Door of Hope facility where our dedicated team of volunteers restore donated cars and then "pay it forward" to people in our community. Since commencement, nearly 200 vehicles have been gifted to people in our community.

MadWheels Youth provides a mentoring program for young people in Northern Tasmania. The program assists students by providing support and access to practical training programs in mechanical skills.

The MadWheels program is 100% run by volunteers, investing approximately 3000 hours each year into the program.

The Resources Ministry Board, a volunteer board made up of Door of Hope congregation business leaders, has played a pivotal role in supporting our church's financial health and mission, enabling us to reinvest in ministry while maintaining and upgrading our facilities.

This year, we have seen significant developments, including securing Government funding to implement security measures across our facility; a \$20,000 grant funding from the state government to support increase in electricity prices; and new Performance Solution for fire protection.

South Launceston Early Learning received a National Design Award for architect Cam Raymond and we trialled a new campus for Hope Discovery Outside School Hours Care at Launceston Christian School.


Operations launched their first staff wellbeing survey, part of Psychosocial safety at work planning, which has become a legislative requirement for Australian organisations. We are glad to be leading the way as a church in response to these requirements, creating safe and healthy places for our employee's work. These enhancements are designed to serve both our church family and the broader community, by using our building and many mission-related activities to build relationships with larger numbers of people in the Launceston area.

NUMBER OF PEOPLE THROUGH DOOR OF HOPE BUILDING






Financially, we have seen God's provision through tithes and offerings with the total amount being \$824,214. This has allowed us to focus on paying capital and interest on our loan, ensuring the financial stability of our church and positioning us well for the future. God has been faithful in providing financial resources for His ministry in our city and beyond.

Each year we undergo an annual external audit to review our financial statements and practices. We also report to the ACNC (the governing body for not for profits and charities) annually. All audited financial statements are published by the ACNC for the public.

EVENTS AND CELEBRATIONS

This year, we hosted a number of significant events and celebrations that brought our community together, highlighting the vibrancy of Door of Hope Christian Church:

HOPF CAMP

One of our largest and most well-attended camps to date, with over 260 people in attendance throughout the weekend, providing opportunities for connection and spiritual growth.

WORKING BEES

A wonderful way for our church community to come together, build relationship and contribute practically to our mission. Projects included upgrading the playground, installing a new floor in Warehouse One, and painting in the Hope Discovery Family Centre (HDFC).

HERITAGE TOURS COMMENCED

Under the dedicated leadership of Jenny and Phenton Gardam and their loyal helpers, monthly tours of our historic building were facilitated, showcasing its rich history and significance to both our community and the City of Launceston.

CENTENARY CELEBRATIONS

This year marked the 100th anniversary of the commencement of production at the Patons ϑ Baldwins spinning mill in Launceston (1923). We celebrated the incredible legacy of this historic building, which DOHCC has proudly owned in part since 2002. For more than 70 years, the mill was a cornerstone of Launceston's economic and social fabric. Our centenary celebrations were a testament to the spirit of adventure, generosity, and faith that characterises our church community, welcoming visitors and sharing our story.
